Have a wonderful Baptismal Anniversary. We cherish you as a member of God's Family here at Zion. We pray that God will continue to bless you richly.

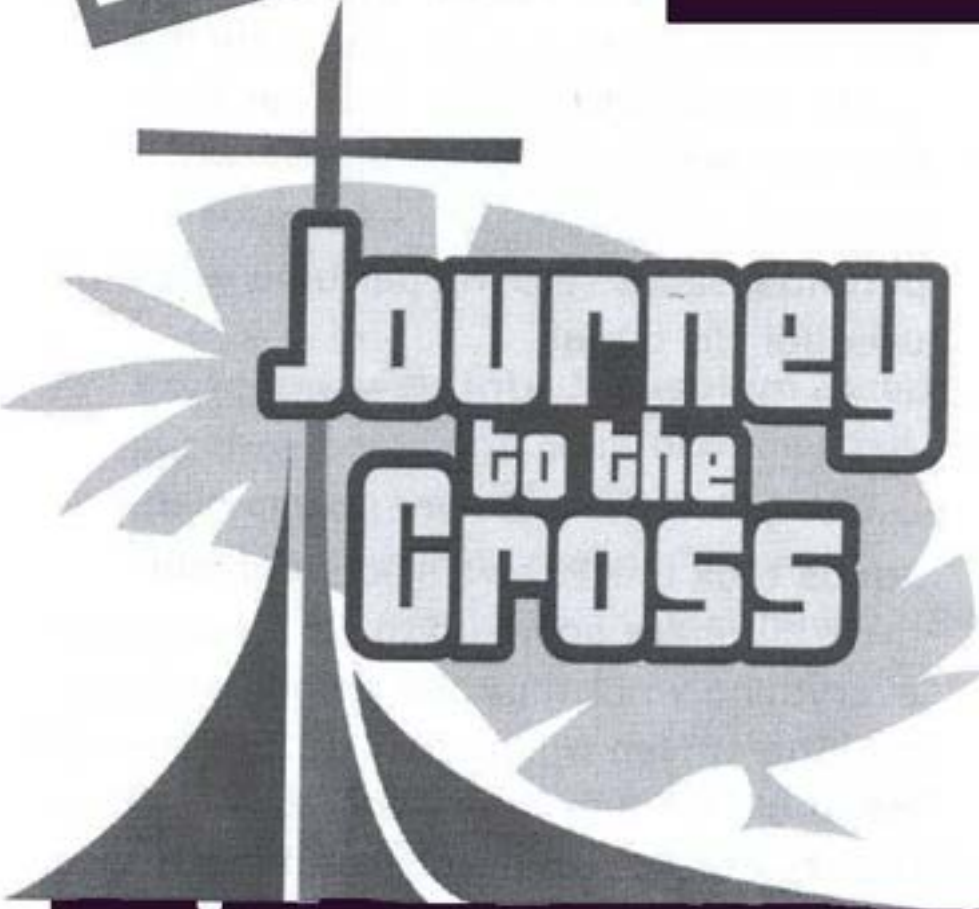

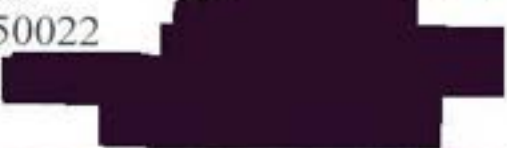

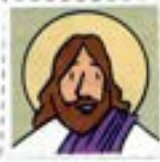

Matthew 21:1-7

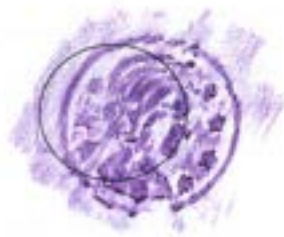


As Jesus rode into Jerusalem, people put their coats and palm branches cut from the trees on the road. They shouted, "Hosanna!" (which means "praise").

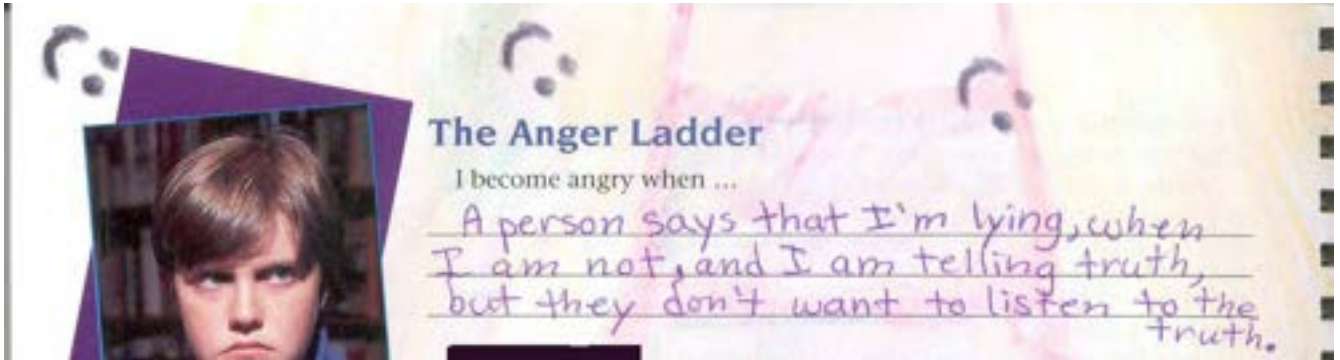

WHY DO PEOPLE SPY?

Although money is usually involved, the motives for spying are far more complex than just greed.

Many convicted spies have identified a number of motivations such as: being angry or disgruntled, financial need, adventure, ego enhancement, and ideology.

Spies do get caught, but often after much damage has been done. For instance, Ronald Pelton, a former NSA employee, compromised a \$3 billion program in return for \$36,000 from the KGB.

WHAT TO REPORT?

Potential espionage indicators:

- drastic changes in behavior, demeanor, or work habits
- unexplained affluence
- financial hardship
- excessive spending or excessive debt
- inappropriate use of photocopy equipment, computer, or printer
- attempts to circumvent security procedures
- unreported foreign national associations
- excessive and/or unreported foreign travel
- after hours access to buildings and classified material
- substance abuse
- unauthorized removal of classified material

REMEMBER....

Espionage is never a victimless crime. The impact to family, friends, coworkers and our national security is devastating.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Protect information and follow basic security guidelines for handling classified information.
- Challenge individuals who request sensitive information from you unless they have a need to know. Report repeated, inappropriate attempts to obtain sensitive or classified information.
- Stay alert. Recognize situational stressors and personality characteristics that lead people to consider espionage. Early intervention in a personal crisis could save someone from making the worst decision of his or her life.

WHAT IS NEED TO KNOW?

As the holder of classified or protected information, you are required to determine if the individual seeking your information has been appropriately cleared and has a "need to know" the information they are requesting.

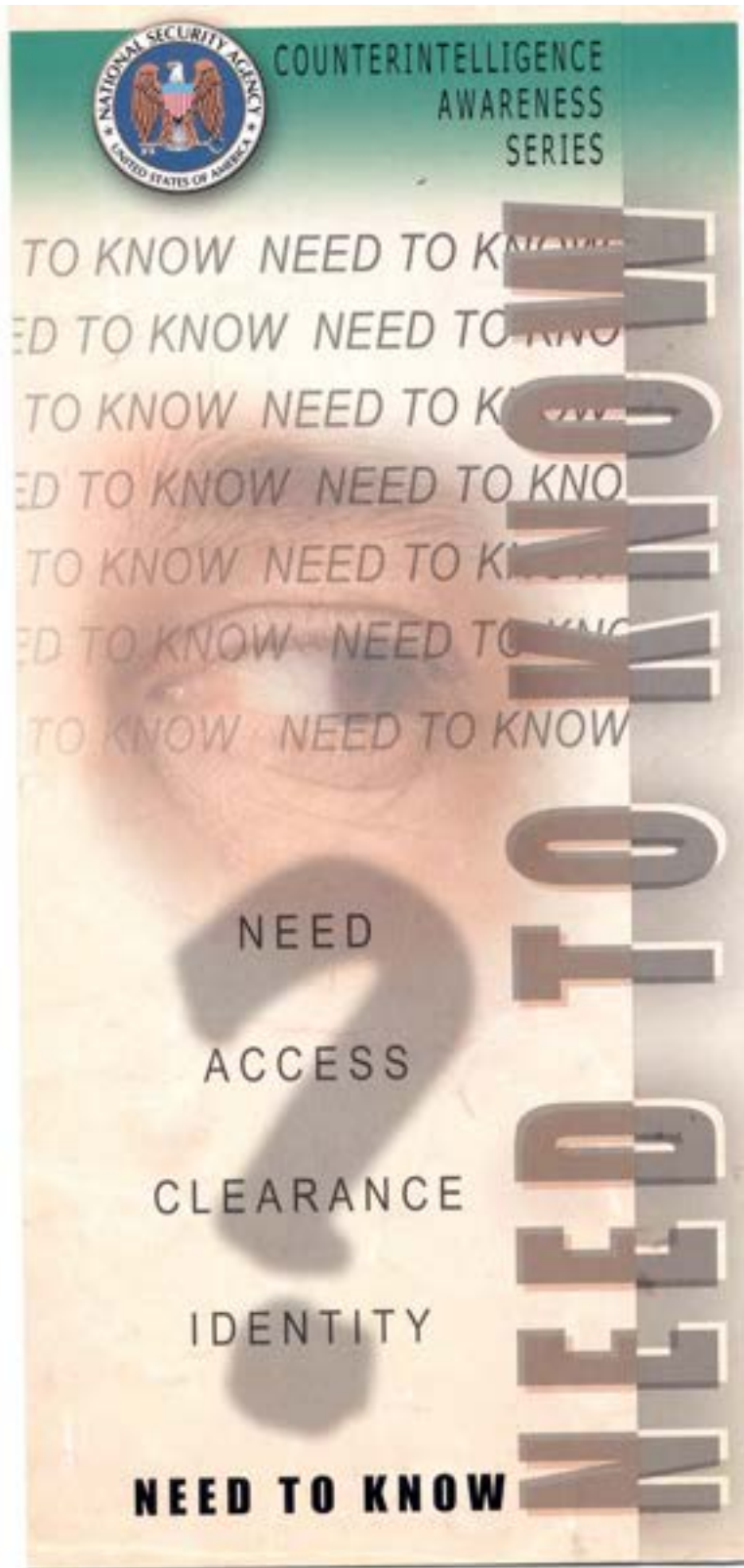

WHAT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY?

- Be aware of individuals seeking classified or protected information through casual conversations, electronic communications, and printed materials.
- Challenge requests for information if you doubt the person has access.
- Check with your supervisor to verify an individual's "need to know."
- Report to your supervisor or security officer unusual or repeated attempts to gain protected or classified information.

HOW CAN YOU ENFORCE NEED TO KNOW?

- Think before you speak.
- Question whether an individual needs the information to perform job duties.
- Determine if the individual is cleared for the information.
- Ensure individuals on receiving end of secure phones (i.e., STU-IIs, STEs, etc.) are cleared for the level of information you plan to discuss. Make sure they have a need to know.
- Limit access to classified data stored in safes.
- Use caution when disseminating electronic communications (i.e., e-mail, Internet, Inetlink, etc.). Consider the size of your audience and whether the information should be openly distributed.
- Prevent unauthorized access to your computer. Use password protection; screen locks; and proper handling, use, and storage of computer media.

Why do you lift your hands?

Psalm 134:2 "Lift up your hands in the sanctuary and bless the Lord."

1 Timothy 2:8 "I will, therefore, that men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting."

Psalm 63:4 "Thus I will bless You while I live; I will lift up my hands in Your name."

What are tongues and what is the point of this language?

Mark 16:17 "And these signs shall follow them that believe...they shall speak in new tongues."

1 Corinthians 14:2 "For he who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God, for no one understands him; however, in the spirit he speaks mysteries."

1 Corinthians 14:14-15 "For if I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit prays, but my understanding is unfruitful. What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also; I will sing with the spirit and I will sing with the understanding also."

Does the Bible condone expressive music and dancing?

Psalm 150:3-5 "Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; praise Him with the psaltery and harp. Praise Him with the tambour and dance; praise Him with stringed instruments and organs. Praise Him upon the loud symbols; praise Him upon the high sounding symbols."

2 Samuel 6:14 "Then David danced before the Lord with all his might."

Ephesians 5:19 "Speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord." See also: Revelation 14:2 & 2 Chronicles 5:12-13

Why do you utter praises to God out loud?

Psalm 47:1 "Oh, clap your hands, all you people! Shout to God with the noise of triumph!"

Psalm 111:1 "Praise the Lord! I will praise the Lord with my whole heart, in the assembly of the upright and in the congregation."

8. The Initial Physical Evidence of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit

The initial physical sign of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives them utterance (Acts 2:4).

9. The Church and its Mission

The church is the body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Holy Spirit. Each believer, born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the general assembly. (Ephesians 1:22,23; 2:22; Hebrews 12:23)

- A. To be an agency of God for evangelizing the world. (Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:19,20; Mark 16:15,16)
- B. To be a cooperative body in which man may worship God. (1 Corinthians 12:13)
- C. To be a channel to build the body of Saints. (Ephesians 4:11-16; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 14:12)

10. Divine Healing

Divine healing is an integral part of the gospel. Deliverance from sickness is provided for by the Atonement and is the privilege of all believers. (Isaiah 53:4,5; Matthew 8:16,17; James 5:14-16)

11. The Blessed Hope

The resurrection of those who have fallen asleep in Christ and their translation, together with those who are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord, is the eminent and blessed hope of the church. (1 Thessalonians 4:16,17; Romans 8:23; Titus 2:13; 1 Corinthians 15:51,52)

12. The Final Judgment

There will be a final judgment in which the wicked dead will be raised and judged according to their deeds. Whosoever is not found written in the Book of Life, together with the devil and his angels, the beast and the false prophets, will be consigned to everlasting punishment in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death. (Matthew 25:26; Mark 9:43-48; Revelation 19:20; 20:11-15; 21:8)

1 Corinthians 12:4 "But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all; for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit work all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills."

John 10:14 "I am the good shepherd, and I know My sheep, and am known by My own. As the Father knows Me, even so I know the Father and I lay down My life for the sheep. And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; these also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock and one shepherd."

John 16:13 "However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come."

Statement of Faith

1. Scriptures Inspired

The Scriptures in both Old and New Testament are inspired of God and are the revelation of God to man the infallible authorities rule of faith and conduct. (2 Timothy 3:15-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Peter 1:21)

2. The One True God

The one true God has revealed Himself as the eternal self-existent "I Am," the Creator of heaven and earth, and the Redeemer of mankind. 3. The Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ

A. Virgin Birth (Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:31,35)

B. Sinless Life (Hebrews 7:26; 1 Peter 2:22)

C. Substitutionary work on the cross
(1 Corinthians 15:3; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

4. The Fall of Man

Man was created good and upright; for God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness." However, by voluntary transgression he fell thereby and incurred not only physical death but spiritual death which is separation from God.
(Genesis 1:26,27; 2:17; 3:6; Romans 5:12-19)

5. The Salvation of Man

Man's only hope of redemption is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

A. Conditions to Salvation. Salvation is received through repentance to God and faith toward Jesus Christ by the washing of regeneration and the renewing of the Holy Spirit, being justified by grace through faith man becomes an heir of God according to the hope of eternal life. (Luke 24:47; John 2:16; Romans 10:13-15; Ephesians 2:8; Titus 2:1; 3:5-7)

B. Evidence of Salvation. The inward evidence of salvation is the direct witness of the Spirit (Romans 8:16). The outward evidence to all men is a life of righteousness and true holiness (Ephesians 4:24; Titus 2:12).

6. Ordinances of the Church

A. Baptism in Water (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:16; Acts 10:47,48; Romans 6:4)

B. Holy Communion (2 Peter 1:4; 1 Corinthians 11:26)

7. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit

All believers are entitled to and should ardently expect and earnestly seek the promise of the Father, the baptism of the Holy Spirit and fire according to the command of the Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of all in the early Christian church. With it comes the endowment of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts and their uses in the work of ministry. (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4-8; 1 Corinthians 12:1-13) This experience is distinct from the subsequent to the experience of the new birth (Acts 8:12-17; 10:44-46; 11:14-16; 15:7-9). With the baptism of the Holy Spirit comes such experiences as an overflowing fullness of the Spirit (John 7:37-39; Acts 4:8); a deeper reverence of God (Acts 2:43; Hebrews 12:28); an intensified consecration to God and dedication to His work (Acts 2:42); and more active love to Christ for His word and for the lost (Mark 16:20).

Check out the question, and response to, "Why does the pastor suddenly call out a name or ask for people with a certain ailment to come to the front of the auditorium?" and also "Why do the pastors say, 'God spoke to me', or 'I heard the Lord say....'. Does God really speak to people? ". How about item #7 where they take God's word out of context: "...baptism of the Holy Spirit and fire...."?
